Alumni Association awards \$15,000 in scholarships

We are proud to announce we have just made our largest annual award to the largest number of scholarship recipients to date. The Ticonderoga High School Class of 2009 received a total of \$15,000 from the Ticonderoga Alumni Association. Sixty-one applicants were awarded funds based on points earned for their academic performance, attendance, citizenship, extracurricular activities, family involvement, and community service during their high school years. To be eligible for the awards, seniors must plan on attending a college or technical school following graduation. The awards are received upon successful completion of their first semester of school. Since 2006 we have awarded \$49,000 to 165 graduating Ticonderoga High School seniors.

Also, through the Alumni's Association affiliation with Dollars for Scholars, six 2009 graduates were able to access an additional \$1,600 by attending Partner Colleges which agreed to match the Association awards.

Based on high school guidance department records, 2009 graduates are attending the following colleges: Clarkson, LeMoyne, NYU, Paul Smiths, RIT, RPI, St. John Fisher, St Lawrence, Siena, Union, as well as various SUNY colleges, community

Our Tournament will continue as the Ticonderoga Alumni Tournament at Mike's request. But in essence and in our hearts it will be the Mike Hayes Memorial Tournament. We thank you, Mike, and we miss you.

Distinguished Alumni Honored

The Distinguished Alumni Committee and Alumni Board of Directors are pleased to announce the newest members to be honored as Distinguished Alumni: Richard (Dick) Arthur, Thomas Burleigh, and Elliott Shaw, Jr. They were recognized in a special ceremony on Friday, July 25.



Richard F. Arthur

Dick Arthur graduated from high school in 1956 as class salutatorian. After working hard to earn the money to attend college, he graduated from Albany College in 1961 with a B.S. in Pharmacy. Upon graduation, a husband and father of 2 small children, he took a job in Burlington, VT before returning to Ticonderoga as Pharmacist/Manager at Meyer Drug.

"Dr."Dick was a familiar face in downtown Ticonderoga for 40 years and well-respected businessman. He purchased the drug store in 1982 and worked until his retirement in 2002. During much of this time, he also served as Director of Pharmacy at Moses Ludington Hospital.

Although a father, husband, and businessman, Dick still found time to serve his community. In 1964 he served as Co-Chairman of the Bicentennial Ball. He also found time to serve on the Ticonderoga Golf Corporation Board of Directors for 20 years and still serves on the boards of the Ticonderoga Federal Credit Union and Valley View Cemetery.

Dick was also highly involved in town government. From 1974 to 1982, he served on the Ticonderoga Town Board and as Police Commissioner in 1976. In 1982 he was appointed Ticonderoga Town Supervisor, the same year he was appointed first Chairman of the Ticonderoga Fire Commission. Dick has also served as Chairman of the town's Board of Ethics Committee.

He co-founded the Adirondack Chapter of the National Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. He also served as area Fund Raising Chairman for the organization.

Dick Arthur's hard work and community involvement exemplify the characteristics of a Distinguished Alumnus.



Thomas F. Burleigh

Tom Burleigh was one of nine children in a family of strong religious faith. He graduated from Ticonderoga High School in 1952 and Union College in 1956.

After graduation he took a job at International Paper Company until he was drafted into the Army. After discharge he returned to IP and worked there for almost 20 years, holding the position of Manager of Sales. In 1978 Tom began work in Sales and marketing for Keith Clark Company. Within 2 and 1/2 years he was named President.

In 1982 Tom took a sales and marketing job with Portals, Incorporated, a British company making currency and high security paper. His territory was the United States and Canada. He soon became Vice President of Sales and Marketing. At the time of his retirement 16 years later, he was President of the US Division of the company.

During his career extensive business travel left him with little leisure time, but this changed with retirement. Visits to nursing homes through the St. Vincent de Paul Society led him to continue to volunteer to help others. He has assisted in the building of a Habitat For Humanity home in Georgia. He has traveled to Lourdes, France for volunteer work with pilgrims visiting the shrine. He has recently started work in Jamaica with Missionaries of the Poor.

He currently volunteers as a case worker for St. Vincent de Paul Society. He can also be found spending a few nights a year in homeless shelters in Atlanta. Tom is particularly proud of his work with I Care in Atlanta. Volunteers of this organization, providing their own vehicle and gas, transport senior citizens to doctor appointments in Georgia. I Care is unique to Atlanta and currently has about 40-45 active volunteers and a full-time director and has provided about 100 round trips for seniors averaging 40-50 miles each. Tom has volunteered with I Care for 11 years and has served on its Board of Directors. He has served as its President for 6 years.

Tom's love and respect for his fellow man is admirable.



Elliott A. Shaw, Jr.

Elliott Shaw, Jr. graduated from Ticonderoga High School in 1977. He graduated from Siena College in 1981 with a degree in business. An internship at the Business Council of New York State led him to a career in government working inside the State Capital. Following the internship, he continued to work at The Business Council for over 20 years and became Director of Government Affairs. During this time he was asked by Governor Cuomo to serve on a panel to select state workers for a special Productivity Award. He was asked by Governor Pataki to represent the business community for a revamping of the state's managed health care laws. He

Elliott is presently working for WellCare of New York as Director of Government Affairs, monitoring and assessing the impact of legislative and regulatory changes to New York's Medicaid system.

He has still found time to serve on many statewide advisory boards as well as a board member of Northeast Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, New York State Department of Health, and the New York State Workers' Compensation Managed Care Boards, to name a few.

Elliott is currently serving on the Albany International Airport Board of Directors, holding the office of Treasurer and serving as chair of the Audit Committee. He is also serving as Board Member of the Community Advisory Board at the SUNY Albany Prevention Research Center.

Elliott enjoys writing book reviews and finds time to be a frequent blood donor. His remarkable career and community involvement make Elliot an ideal person for the Distinguished Alumni Award.

Special Service Awards Bestowed

On Friday, July 25 Special Service Awards were given to John Bartlett and posthumously to Donald Gijanto, Sr. for their service to the community of Ticonderoga. For more information on this award, please visit the Alumni website and click on "Special Service Awards."

John Bartlett

John Bartlett graduated from Ticonderoga High School in 1970. After a career as an insurance actuary, John took early retirement and returned to Ticonderoga with his wife Joanne in 2005. Since that time John has been actively involved in the community.

He joined the School District Community Facilities Committee which planned the school building project presently underway. He was appointed chair of the Finance Committee which explored the financial impact of taxpayers. He prepared a spreadsheet which disclosed the annual impact of the building project on taxpayers, helping the public have a better understanding of its effect on tax bills.

John was then recruited by the

Ticonderoga Montcalm Street Partnership which is dedicated to the revival and improvement of the historic downtown and asked to join its Board of Directors in 2008. As its Program Coordinator, he administered the final year of a \$125,000 grant. He is presently Chair of its Design Committee and pursuing ways to implement parts of a streetscape plan which was funded by the grant.

His service also extends to town gov-

ernment. A frequent attendee of town committee and board meetings, John has joined the Economic Development and Parks and Recreation Committees and other committees. He has written grants to help reduce expenditures and benefit the town and its taxpayers.

In addition, John is an active member of Kiwanis Club and is serving on the Ticonderoga Quality Destination Committee.

Don Gijanto graduated from Ticonderoga High School in 1948. He enlisted in the Army and served his country during

the Korean War. He was later awarded the Medal for Merit and the Conspicuous Service Star. Following his service,

he returned to Ticonderoga and opened the Adirondack Lanes with his brother, becoming its sole proprietor in 1974.

During his lifetime he was a member of the Elks and served as Exalted Ruler. He joined Kiwanis Club of Ticonderoga in 1961 and at the time of his death was the club's longest serving active member with 37 years of service. As a Kiwanian he served a club president and District Lieutenant Governor. He worked with the Kiwanis team that worked on the development and building of different structures at Bicentennial Park and coached the club's Little League team.

In 1981 he joined the Knights of Columbus and rose to the rank of 4th degree Knight. He held many positions including Grand Knight, district Warden, District Deputy, and member of the Color Corps. He was instrumental in the creation of the K of C Golf Tournament and served as

co-chair. In 1998 Don was named the Knights of Columbus Irishman of the Year for service to the organization and the community.


