## Summer Gala Week Planned

On July 24, 1794 John Stoughton, a lieutenant in the King's Army, received a royal land grant constituting much of the northern outlet of Lake George for his service in the French and Indian War. He and his family would settle on this land, thus starting the history of the community of Ticonderoga.

Never a town to pass up a chance to celebrate, Ticonderoga has commemorated this event (and the Civil War & War of 1812) for the past 2 years with "Ticonderoga the First 250 Years". This summer the celebration, which has focused on preserving, sharing and celebrating our common past, will be culminated with a Gala Week.

This week, co-sponsored by Ticonderoga's Historical Society and Heritage Museum



and in cooperation with Fort Ticonderoga, will include a day-long celebration in the park ending with a Ruby School Concert and Fireworks on July 24th, our Alumni Annual Awards Ceremony on Friday the

25th, Streetfest and our annual Alumni Golf Tournament on the 26th, events at the fort, as well as talks, slide shows and a street dance.

## Scholarship Awards Break the \$100,000 Mark

Thirty-one members of the Class of 2013 had the opportunity to share the \$17,500 Alumni Association Scholarship Award pool. These scholarships bring the total amount of awards made since 2006, the first year of the program, to \$111,500.

Students who plan to attend college, technical school, or enter military service may apply

for the awards in May of their senior year. Award amounts are determined by points a student earns during his/her four years in high school and are given for GPA, attendance, good behavior, extracurricular activities, community service, and family involvement in school activities. Students receive their award payments when they successfully complete their first semester of college.

This year's awards ranged from \$310 to \$685, with an average award of \$564. We thank our alumni and friends for supporting the Alumni Scholarship Program with their donations. We know the 307 graduating seniors who have been awarded our scholarships since 2006 are especially appreciative. Look for a few comments from them in this newsletter.

## Distinguished Alumni Awards

### LtCol Peter Charboneau (Ret)

For the second time the association honored an alumnus with a career in the Marine Corps (Jim King in 2005). However, this time there was one remarkable difference. Lieutenant Colonel Peter Charboneau (Ret) was a "mustang", an enlisted man who worked his way up the ranks to officer status. Less than one percent of enlisted Marines reach the rank of lieutenant colonel.

Peter was the seventh of eight children and enlisted in the Marines following his graduation in 1980. After enlisting in the marines in 1982, Peter began his remarkable climb up the ranks. He was soon involved in the Hawk Missile system and continued to work in ground radar and missile systems throughout his career. Superiors noted "he was a gifted natural leader who was dynamic, decisive, and intelligent" and "a leader who possesses an uncanny ability to sell ideals and influence others with great success."

Along the way, in addition to military training, Peter also received an Associate of Missile Technology Degree, a B.S. Degree in Management/Computer Information Technology, and a M.B.A. in Strategic Management, all as an Honor Graduate. He served three tours of combat duty in Iraq in direct support of Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Peter received numerous military honors including Master Instructor of the Year, Officer of the Year, several Commendation awards, and two Meritorious Service Medals. In 2011 Peter was awarded our nation's sixth highest medal, the Legion of Merit, for his exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service and far reaching contributions to the Air and Missile Defense Community.

During this exemplary career he performed the ultimate community service: almost 30 years of service to his country! Peter is currently Director of Thales-Raytheon Systems' Battlefield Radar Strategic Business Development.



### Anne Burleigh McDonald

Anne Burleigh McDonald is the third member of the Burleigh family to receive the Distinguished Alumni Award, following in the footsteps of her brother Tom and older sister Virginia B. LaPointe. She graduated from Russell Sage College and received her Master's Degree from SUNY Plattsburgh.

Anne began a career as a classroom teacher which spanned 35 years, primarily as a kindergarten teacher. She worked in the North Colonie, Moriah, and Ticonderoga school districts. She was well-liked and respected by both parents and co-workers. She is to be commended for her role in starting the Young 5 Kindergarten Program in Ticonderoga. Because of her diligence, many 5 year olds have been given the opportunity to become more ready for the regular school program and

more successful in later school years. Anne is a member of Delta Kappa Gamma, an honorary educational society.

She has also done extensive work in regional, educational, professional, political, and civic organizations. Anne has served on the Independent Judicial Qualification Committee and was appointed by governors to the Board overseeing the Great Sacandaga Reservoir and the Black River Regulatory Board. She has also served on county and state Republican Committees and as a National Delegate.

At a more local level she is currently a member of the North Country Community College Board of Directors as well as its Foundation Board. She is a member of the local Heritage Museum's Board and Co-Chair of the Fortifiers, a group of volunteers assisting Ft. Ticonderoga's annual fund drives. Anne was also recently appointed to the Fort Ticonderoga Board of Directors at a most important time when new programs, activities, and policies are being considered or instituted.

Along with her numerous accomplishments, Anne and her husband John have raised three children. Her son John McDonald Jr. is the current Superintendent of Ticonderoga Central School District.

## Special Service Awards



### June E. Curtis

After graduating from THS in 1963, June Curtis attended Albany State, graduating with a B.A. in Liberal Arts. She stayed in the Albany area and worked for AT&T for 34 years. She took early retirement and worked for another small telephone company before making the decision to retire and return to Ticonderoga.

June enrolled in the Grant Institute and became an accomplished grant writer. The Ticonderoga Historical Society, Food Pantry, Champlain Legacy Park, and Ticonderoga Arts have all benefited from her grant writing skills.



She also helped the fledgling Arts organization receive their 501 c 3 designation. A strong supporter of the Arts, June was a member of the former Arts Council for the Northern Adirondacks Board. She also has been a member of the Ticonderoga Area Cultural Arts Initiative since its beginning, working to promote cultural events in our area.

Her love of history is evident. She has written many grants for the Hancock House which have resulted in new exhibits and special programs. She is most active in the Adirondack History Center and serves on its Program Committee and Board. She is also a member of the Ticonderoga, the First 250 Years Committee which will hold its culminating event, The Gala Week, this July. She enjoys encouraging children's love of history and has served as a judge of History Day Student Projects at Ft. Ticonderoga for several years.

Her advocacy of history and cultural arts has been most beneficial to our community. We commend her many accomplishments.



### Susan (Roark) Liddell

Sue Liddell also graduated in 1963. Upon graduation she attended and graduated from Adirondack Community College. She married her high school sweetheart Dick. From this time on her commitment to family, community, and her religion has been most evident. Her four children's activities, sports, jobs, and clubs became her activities and part of her volunteer life. Her involvement in Cub Scout leadership began when her boys were young and continued long after they were no longer members. She was a long-time member of the THS Booster Club and active in forming the sports Hall of Fame. When a son joined the fort's Fife and Drum Corps, Sue joined as a fort volunteer and continued for many years.

Sue's volunteer work in the community has been extensive. A mainstay of the Champlain Valley Chorale for many years, she has also supported the Ticonderoga Festival Guild as a board member and as president. Although not a player herself, she has become an indispensable worker at local golf tournament fundraisers. The K of C and our Alumni Association are most appreciative of her

tournament work. Sue is a current member of the Alumni Association Board. We appreciate her knowledge and wisdom and her willingness to coordinate our bowling tournament the past 2 years.

### Friend of Ticonderoga High School Award Deborah Breitenbach

Non-alumna Debbie Breitenbach is an outstanding teacher whose love of students,

school, curriculum and community are evident. She has worked in Ticonderoga High School since 1979 as a secondary English teacher.

She has supported her school in numerous ways. She has worked to develop/continue school curriculum and academic excellence through membership on Program Development, Excellence and Accountability, and Building Leadership Teams, and the Effective Schools and Athletic Code of Conduct Committees. She has also served as English Department Co-Chair and Teachers Helping Students Advisor.

Her contributions to students are admirable. She cares for, respects, and encourages students, even continuing contact with them long after they have graduated. She is a member of the College for Every Student Committee and National Honor Society Advisor for many years. ## Food Backpack Program Takes Off

Two Ti Alumni, John and Joanne Wells Bartlett ('70 & '71), have worked with the local Kiwanis Club and the Ticonderoga School District to create a highly successful backpack program that provides weekend food for area elementary and middle school children.

The idea for the program started after John heard the story of two local elementary students who said they were not looking forward to summer vacation fearing that without the school's lunch program they might go hungry some days. Knowing that juvenile hunger is a growing problem locally and in America, they learned the Regional Food Bank of Northeastern New York would provide weekend food and menus for backpacks at a cost of \$167 per child for the school year. By January 2013 enough money had been raised to provide backpacks and food for 30 students at Ticonderoga Elementary School.

In one year's time, contributions from individuals and organizations have allowed the program to expand to provide food for

120 students, including Ti Middle School, St. Mary's, Putnam, and a satellite program at Crown Point. John and Joanne have been overwhelmed by the community support of their undertaking. Grants have also been utilized with the largest coming from Kiwanis International Foundation (\$7,500).

Kiwanians unload the food delivery at the Armory, and the backpacks are packed by local student service clubs weekly. On Fridays, the backpacks are brought to the Ticonderoga Elementary- Middle School by Kiwanis members where Joanne, the school nurse, supervises their distribution to students selected by the school. Similar deliveries are made to St. Mary's and Putnam schools.

John sums up the reasons for the backpack program very simply, "No child in America should go hungry," and "How can we expect hungry kids to be good learners?" Anyone wishing to help out, learn more or make a donation may contact John at [jbartlett1@nycap.rr.com](mailto:jbartlett1@nycap.rr.com)

PJ Joubert was an outstanding athlete in high school and was inducted into the THS Athletic Hall of Fame. He spent the majority of his career teaching and coaching at Ticonderoga High School. PJ was also well-known as a lifeguard at Black Point Beach and as a pilot of Mohican on Lake George.

THS ladies class ring in a cigar box his father had given him. He wanted to return this ring inscribed with the initials SAH to its owner. Upon investigation, board members found a Shirley A. Holmes in the 1953 Yearbook and her address and phone number listed on information from the last Class of 1953 Reunion. Following a phone call to a very surprised Shirley Hirt in Hudson, NY, the ring was returned. ## Sentinel Support Fund Created

The Ticonderoga Alumni Association has created a matching fund to help support educational activities that might be cut during difficult financial times.

Starting in the second semester of the 2013-14 school year, student and school groups may apply for a matching grant of up to \$250 to help finance field trips, programs, speakers, and other school endorsed activities. To be eligible for the match, applicants must provide the Alumni Association Review Committee with a description of the project and its educational impact, project budget, and a

This year, \$1000 has been set aside for the Sentinel Support Fund. 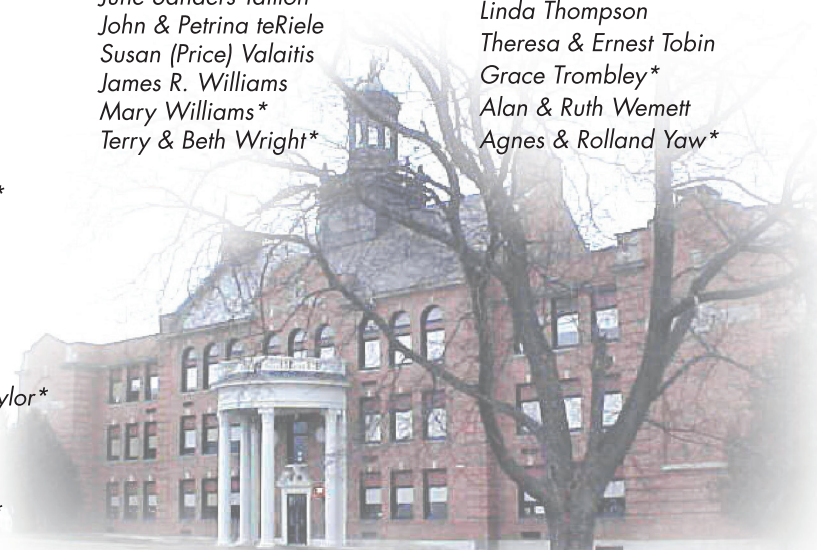
