Distinguished Alumni Awards



Bernard (Ben) H. Leerkes '64

Strong Community Roots

Ben was 11 years old when his family came from Holland to the United States to establish a dairy farm in Ticonderoga. The oldest of 10 children, Ben graduated from Ticonderoga High School in 1964. He received a NYS Regents Scholarship and attended Manhattan College, earning his Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering. But an engineering career was not in the cards when International Paper Company purchased the family farm to construct the "new" mill. The family purchased the old Cook farm and Ben offered to join his father and start a new farm. This successful business eventually included over 600 acres and about 160 livestock.



While fulfilling the long-day demands of farming, he has performed extensive community service, including the Cornell Cooperative Educational Services Board of Directors, Essex County Farm Bureau Director from 1971-2018, Miner Institute Research Institute Farm Board, Dairy- Lea and AgriMark Co-operatives, and Northern New York Agriculture Development Board. Ben is also a strong supporter of St. Mary's School and for many years served as Chairman of the Ticonderoga Planning Board.



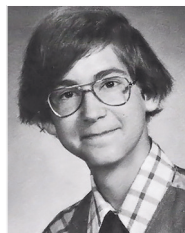
Mark Wright '80

Science and Community

Overcoming Acute Lymphocytic Leukemia, Mark graduated (on time) with the Ticonderoga Class of 1980. He attended Adirondack Community College and graduated from Syracuse University in 1984 with a Bachelor's Degree in Aerospace Engineering. In 1984, Mark married Laura Barron (THS, Class of 1980.)

His career has included work for the Department of the Air Force as a Safety Analyst and Department Chief. In 2001, he became part of the Federal Aviation Administration's Commercial Space Division. Mark is a recipient of the coveted Federal Aviation Administration's Golden Wings Award for Professional Services. In 2016, Mark and Laura moved back to Ticonderoga, where he continued to work for the FAA, recently retiring in 2019.

Mark is an active member of the Ticonderoga Community. An avid local history buff, he has shared his impressive collection of Ticonderoga memorabilia on-line at "If you grew up in Ticonderoga". He currently serves as a member of the Ticonderoga Heritage Museum Board, and as a member of the Fire Commission.



Special Service Awards



MARY CUNNINGHAM '74

Protecting the health and safety of the community

Mary Cunningham graduated from THS in 1974 and attended SUNY Plattsburgh, where she graduated with a degree in Health and Science. During her time in college, she coached swimming, basketball and track at St. Johns Academy.



The tragic death of her sister, Michelle, in a 1977 automobile accident inspired Mary to become an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). In 1984, Mary joined the International Paper staff as an EMT/ Security Guard where she helped organize the Medical Emergency Response Team. She also served as a member of the Ticonderoga Ambulance Squad for 15 years. She joined the Fire Department in 1993, serving as an officer for 23 years and was president for 21 of those years. Mary was also instrumental in helping to set up the Hall of Flame Museum at the Fire Department. As a CPR First Aid Instructor, she has taught life-saving techniques to over 4,000 people. As Chair of the local American Cancer Society Relay for Life, she has helped raise over \$90,000.

Corinna Woods'90

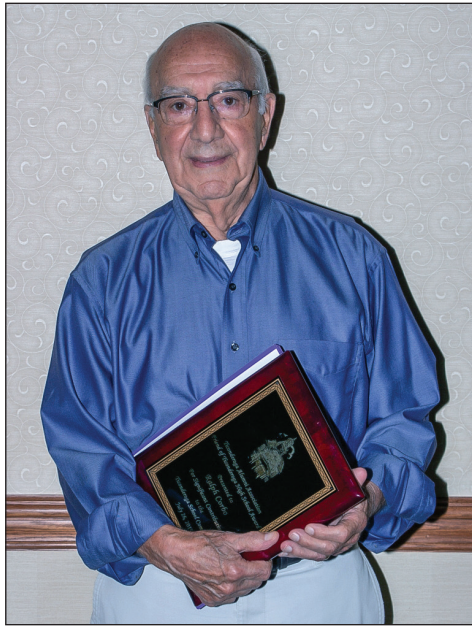
It's All about Kids

Corinna graduated from Ticonderoga High School in 1990. She attended Boston College. During her college years she began working with youth. Corinna worked as a Program Director for Camp Wakpominnee (a Boy Scout camp) summers from 1990-2012. She would later serve as Health Director at Curtis S. Reed Scout Center and Treasure Valley Scout Camp. In 1998, Corinna took job as a Teaching Assistant and Job Coach at Ticonderoga Central School District. Corinna also works at Great Escape Lodge as a safety officer and EMT, is Assistant First Aid Coordinator and EMT at Silver Bay YMCA, and acts as a medical consultant for the Lehigh Valley Phantoms, an affiliate of the NHL Philadelphia Flyers.



In 2014, Corinna became Assistant Director of the local Summer Youth Program. She soon became the Camp Director for the program. Besides Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts, Corinna is still actively involved with children through the Ticonderoga Karate Club, Little League, Youth Soccer, Ticonderoga Tee Ball, and Youth Basketball.

Friend of Ticonderoga High School Award



Ralph Corbo

After graduation from Mineville HS, attending Cortland, and serving in the US Army, Ralph graduated from Plattsburgh State Teachers' College. In 1959, he joined the Ticonderoga Central School faculty as a 7th-8th Science Teacher.



During his 17 years as a science teacher, Ralph would also coach baseball, Middle School football, and serve as a class advisor.

In 1977, Ralph accepted the position of Principal of the Ticonderoga Middle School Principal, where he would help create a student-centered school. In 1984, Ralph became principal of the high school, a position he would hold until his retirement in 1995. As principal, he was instrumental in establishing the Senior Project Program and Natural Helpers, an initiative that would train students to provide counseling and conflict resolution for their peers.

As a member of the community, Ralph served as President of the Ticonderoga Federal Credit Union, and continues to be an active member of the Knights of Columbus and supporter of St. Mary's Church and School.

High School Partners with TRA

To help meet the shortage of contractors in the area and to provide career and technical training for students, the high school counselors have created a partnership with the Ticonderoga Revitalization Alliance (TRA), a non-profit organization dedicated to strengthening the economy of the Ticonderoga area.

TRA received a \$95,000 federal business development grant to provide tuitions for Ticonderoga High School seniors to attend the CV-Tec program in Mineville, NY. The grant also funded the production of a brochure that outlines for juniors and seniors the technical training programs available through BOCES and at regional colleges. The grant will also fund 8-week summer internships for students, allowing them to gain real-life work experience.

A major aspect of the grant is "Contractors in the Classroom," which will bring different contractors into the classroom to work side-by-side with students. The goal of this project is to expose students to careers in the trades by providing skilled mentors who may become potential employers.

The grant will also help fund a Trade Education Scholarship that will support local students' desire to pursue a trades-related education.

More from the President:

As the Alumni Connection is about to go to print, our school is faced with another challenge! Due to the threat of the coronavirus, Ticonderoga School District is closed until at least April 19th and all school activities have been suspended. The School Board, administration, teachers, and staff are hard at work attempting to assist families in meeting the needs of our students and maintain an educational system in these trying times. I have no doubt our Alumni Association will do all in its power to support these efforts. Coach Stevenson used to have a sign in the locker room: "When the going gets tough, the tough get going." It's time for us to get tough!

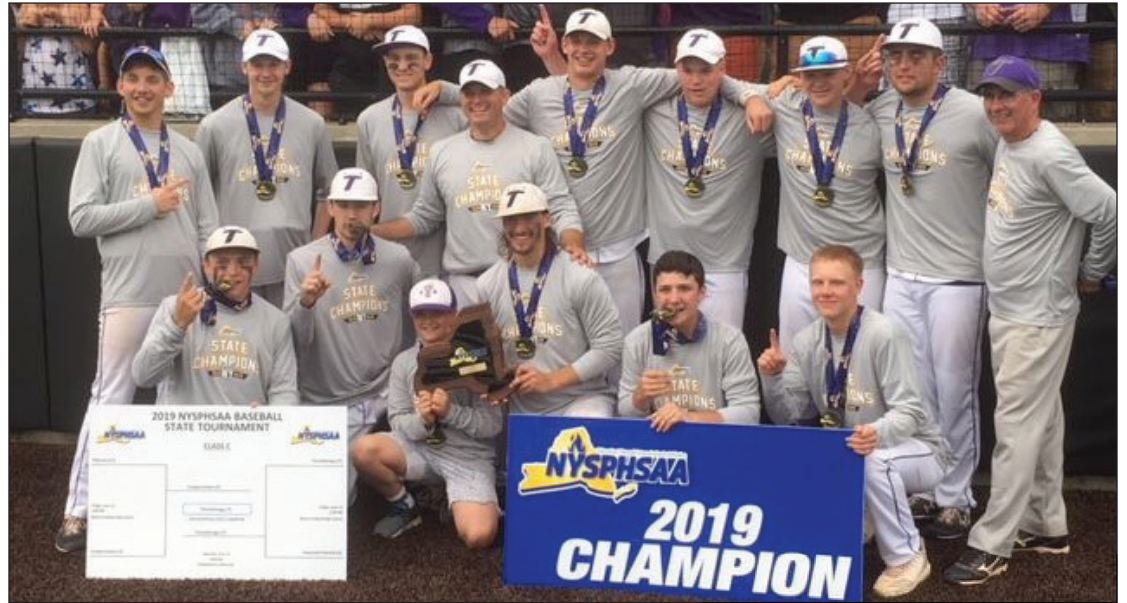

The 2019 Sentinel Baseball team was one for the record books. The team captured the school's first team state championship in June, defeating Cooperstown High School at SUNY Binghamton. The Sentinels advanced in the playoffs thanks to a 15-0 victory over Lake Placid at the sectional level. Russ Gallo's 7 inning gem on the mound helped the Sentinels to a 9-1 win over previously unbeaten #1 ranked Fort Plain, and propelled Coach Dorsett's squad onto the final weekend of the season. A 3-1 victory over Gananda punched Ti's ticket to the title game, thanks to timely hits by Jack Grinnell and Mike DuShane that matched another great outing from Gallo. Senior Michael DuShane got the ball for the championship game and delivered, combining with Bryce Gautreau for a complete game no hitter, and a 7-1 season-ending victory.

In addition to Gallo and Dushane, the Sentinels were led by a group of seniors who all made huge contributions throughout the season.
